1. Testimony Before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. My testimony in open session before the Committee concerned the foreign assistance budget, but the questions covered numerous foreign policy issues and El Salvador was not the center of attention. Nearly every Senator in the Committee was present and there was full media coverage. Senators Baker, Lugar, and Hayakawa were particularly helpful. (U)

2. Automobile Imports. In line with our discussion on March 18, I discussed the automotive topic with Mike Mansfield and he will proceed to discuss the issue with Japanese Foreign Minister Ito prior to his departure to the United States on Saturday. (C)
