The Argentine Government has warned that if the Uganda and other hospital ships "have not retreated by 00.00 hours on 29th May to a distance which leaves no doubt as to their activity they will cease to be regarded as hospital shipd and will be treated as hostile."

This follows Friday's suggestion that the SS Uganda was impeding the movements of combatants and violating Article 30 Of the second Geneva Convention. They have further suggested on 29th May that the ship is being used for military purposes.

The British Government wish to make it quite clear that these allegations are completely unfounded. It has already provided the Argentine authorities with full details of the movements and activities of the Uganda up to now, and these are in full accordance with the Geneva Convention.

We have now provided detailed information on the activities of British hospital ships for the forseeable future in the areas concerned. Neither the SS Uganda nor any other British hospital ship is being used for any military purpose whatsoever. Their only intention is to aid the evacuation and treatment of casualties, a great arm of whom are Argentine.

The British Government reserves the right to use hospital ships when and where appropriate in order to provide assistance to the wounded - British or Argentine . The SS Uganda is a clearly marked hospital ship and is operating, and will continue to operate in accordance with the Geneva Convention. It is providing humanitarian assistance to casualties of both sides, any military action committed by the Argentine authorities against this or any other similar vessel will be a flagrant breach of the Geneva Convention and shall be the full responsibility of the Argentine Government.
